They found refuge and settled along the San Pedro Shoreline. They brought with

old. For thousands of years before the shrimpers arrived, indigenous Miwok people lived along the San Pedro hills, as documented by the numerous middens in the park. It is this history that we celebrated in August. In the hours leading up to this year's event, volunteers busily hung bright red Chinese lanterns on wooden awnings, which swung gently as performers set up their instruments and adjusted their ornate costumes...

1927 - 2019





Over the past few months, vandals and thieves have stolen cash and damaged electronic pay stations and metal fee envelope receptacles (iron rangers) in the

Executive Director Martin Lowenstein is pleased to announce that an anonymous donor has just given \$500 to FOCC for pay station repairs. Lowenstein estimates that FOCC is still facing a \$4,000 expense to purchase one refurbished pay station and a \$2,000 expense for three new iron rangers.



Map to meeting location






