



New Law:

FOCC had two experts on hand to share their knowledge: Alicia Retes, of the Museum of the American Indian in Novato, and Jerry Coe, an avid volunteer naturalist for FOCC. No Smoking at State Parks and Beaches

**Lighting Up is No Longer Allowed in the Park** 

cigarette or cigar waste unless in an appropriate waste receptacle. The law allows smoking in parking lots and on paved roads. Violators may be fined up to \$25. The ban goes into effect January 2020 but can be enforced only once "No Smoking" signs are installed. The bill's sponsors hope that the new law will enhance fire safety as well as public health. According to the California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection, for the past five years, 44 of California's wildfires annually have been attributed to smoking.

In October 2019, Governor Newsom signed Senate Bill 8 -- a bill prohibiting smoking or vaping (tobacco, marijuana and electronic cigarettes) at state parks and beaches, including those operated by entities who have entered into an agreement with the California Department of Parks and Recreation, such as Friends of China Camp. The law also prohibits disposal of
